



# Camp Compass 2010

Some children find it difficult to navigate their way in social situations. They need specific teaching, coaching, and practice to learn the fundamental building blocks of social success.

**Camp Compass** is an activity-based experience to support children in developing social thinking skills. Some children that attend camp have neurodevelopmentally based challenges with social interactions, making and keeping friends, and participating in cooperative learning situations. **Camp Compass** capitalizes on students' strengths and maximizes their potential.

Based on Michelle Winner's *ILAUGH Model of Social Thinking*, campers practice specific skills with one another. Students embrace the opportunity to learn through hands-on, theme based experiences and activities.

## Activities are designed to teach the following skills:

- Joint attention
- Reciprocal interactions
- Initiating conversations
- Linking and coordinating ideas
- Conversation repair strategies
- Self-regulation
- Understanding the thoughts and feelings of others
- Coordination of self-feelings and ideas with the thoughts and feelings of others
